Grading Distribution

Students receive numerical grades on a quarterly and semester basis. The final course grade is calculated as 22.5% for each quarter and 10% for the final examination. Grade average is determined by dividing the sum of the grades in all courses by the number of courses. Grades in Physical Education and Health are not included in the calculation of grade average. All courses listed on rosters and grade reports are college unit courses unless designated by "H" (Honors) or "AP" (Advanced Placement). All Honors and AP courses are "weighted" courses. Each Honors and/or AP course is calculated with an additional five (5) quality points per credit. **HUDSON CATHOLIC DOES NOT RANK STUDENTS.**
